Calabrating Our 4th Year of Gaellbhratachl

This year, we are delighted to mark our fourth year participating in the Gaelbhratach initiative, a fontastic program that encourages schools to promote and celebrate the Irish language in daily life. Gaelbhratach is not just about learning Irish in the classroom, it's about creating a culture of Gaeilge throughout our school community.

The program involves setting goals, organising activities, and fostering an environment where everyone is encouraged to use and enjoy the Irish language.

Always cognisant of their award winning commitment to Green Schools (having been awarded their tenth Green Flag in June) and their strong commitment to the promotion of development education and sustainability (recognised as School of the Year in 2022 by Dept. of Foreign Affairs), the focus for their creative body of work was fast fashion. The pupils researched the ethical questions surrounding sustainability, consumer choice, environmental impact and the rights of workers. The culmination of their work saw the production of a body of work entitled 'Dressed to Empress or Dressed to Destroy' Their work included the composition of songs, poems, letter writing, report writing and impressively, the repurposing of discarded clothes into new articles of clothing. Very kindly, the charity shops in Nenagh agreed to display their work.





We are delighted to be partaking in Green Schools again this year. We are working on our eleventh Green Flag on the theme of Primary Climate Ambassadors. Climate education empowers both students and teachers. We want everyone to feel the benefits of being closer to nature. Our school will be a place which will inspire climate action for the whole community.

As part of our seasonal programme of activities, we held our very successful recycled Christmas Decoration Competition. We had hundreds of entries. This competition encourages us to make a Christmas decoration from recycled material only. The standard was really high as always. We held an exhibition in the school hall so that all classes could see and admire our hard work. Everyone who took part was awarded a certificate. It is wonderful to see the creativity in the school.
